We can't be with our children at all times, but we can learn ways to help keep them safe when we're not there. Employees and those volunteers who have contact with minors or vulnerable adults are required to have initial training at the start of their work if they have never taken it before.

Our Safe Environment Program requirements are met through our Virtus database, and when you create your profile you'll be prompted to register for an initial training session. We have two formats available for initial training: an in-person group session at a parish or school which takes about 3 hours; OR an internet-based personal session which you can do from your home computer in about 90 minutes. Either format fulfills the requirement for initial training. *Protecting God's Children for Adults* was written and developed by *Virtus*, a program developed by the National Catholic Risk Retention Group.

You'll learn:

- Facts and myths about child sexual abuse;
- How offenders gain access to children;
- Warning signs to look for in children, or adults;
- Actions to take when you notice warning signs.
