


# Mission Cooperative Plan



The Archdiocese of Seattle's Mission Cooperative Plan (MCP) provides mission causes from around the world the opportunity to educate about God's work among the poor and to raise funds for the building up of the Church in mission territories. MCP speakers are clergy, religious or laypeople who share their stories at parishes during weekend liturgies, often providing weekend help, and enabling parishioners to hear about the missionary experience. In this way, the MCP offers an opportunity to promote solidarity with the universal Church.

## How Parishes Select and Schedule MCP Speakers

1. Review the list of approved mission organizations.
2. Contact the organization to arrange a speaking engagement. Parishes can host an approved speaker throughout the calendar year, except during the Annual Catholic Appeal (mid April to mid May) or those times when archdiocesan collections, national/mission appeals, or your own parish's stewardship renewal occur. 3. If the selected speaker is from outside the Archdiocese of Seattle, written permission is required from the archdiocese. Speaker request forms are available at [archseattle.org/speaker-request-forms/](http://archseattle.org/speaker-request-forms/). Once approved, the parish will be notified.
4. Once scheduled and approved, please send the name of the mission cause, speaker and dates for the speaking engagement to Chris Koehler, Director of Missions and Immigrant Affairs at [chris.koehler@seattlearch.org](mailto:chris.koehler@seattlearch.org).

## Accommodations for Speakers

Travel, accommodations, and meals are the responsibility of the speakers' organizations. While not required, parishes may choose to provide some assistance and do what they can to make the speaker feel welcomed to the parish and archdiocese.

## Collection Instructions

Parishes should arrange for a collection to be taken to support the mission cause. If collection envelopes are provided by the mission cause, these should be collected and processed by the parish office. Please note: The speaker is not to receive any funds, offering envelopes, or donor names and addresses. Please send the total amount collected in one parish check [*Insert in check memo line: (Name of Mission Cause) (Parish ID#)*] to the Annual Campaigns and Parish Support Office (see address below), which will combine the funds from all the parishes hosting the mission speaker and forward the total amount to the mission cause.
